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# Message from the Investment and Finance Office



July was a landmark month shaped by high-level strategic diplomacy, key industrial milestones, and expanding global partnerships. Together, these developments reflect a clear focus on reinforcing Türkiye's economic resilience, deepening international cooperation, and strengthening its position as a powerhouse for investment, innovation, and strategic industries.

At the center of this momentum was the NATO Summit, hosted in Ankara, returning to Türkiye after 22 years. Convened under the leadership of President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan, the summit brought together heads of state, senior decisionmakers, and top executives from across the alliance.

The landmark event not only underscored Türkiye's strategic role in the global security architecture but also showcased the country's advanced manufacturing capabilities, defense technology ecosystem, and high-value investment potential to international stakeholders.

Technology and innovation remained at the forefront of Türkiye's investment agenda throughout the month. This momentum was also reflected internally, as the Office's OKR framework received a Productivity Award from the Ministry of Industry and Technology in recognition of its contribution to organizational effectiveness.

Google unveiled a strategic USD 2 million initiative and a policy roadmap at the AI Tomorrow Summit to accelerate public sector innovation and cloud capabilities in Türkiye. This commitment to digital ecosystem growth was further reinforced during the Cybersecurity Networking Event in Washington, D.C., where the Office highlighted Türkiye's advancing cybersecurity capabilities and high-tech investment potential to U.S. business leaders.

Sector-focused platforms further demonstrated Türkiye's alignment with global green transition priorities. At the BESS Investment Forum, the Office outlined Türkiye's ambitious target of reaching 120 GW of installed wind and solar capacity by 2035, supported by battery energy storage systems.

This narrative was further reinforced during the Italy Meets Türkiye: Clean Energy Transition event, which showcased cross-border investment opportunities in renewable energy infrastructure and technology transfer as Türkiye prepares to host COP31.

Participation finance also remained a key priority throughout the month. The International Takaful Summit in London brought together leading stakeholders from the global Islamic finance ecosystem. Discussions focused on the strategic positioning of the Istanbul Financial Center (IFC), its competitive incentive framework, and its vision to serve as a regional hub for participation finance and sustainable climate investments.

Across Asia, Europe, and beyond, the Office continued to advance Türkiye's investment narrative through targeted, sector-specific engagements.

In Asia, the Office conducted a dedicated machinery roadshow in Japan in collaboration with the Japan Institute for Overseas Investment (JOI).

Likewise, a joint seminar with Catalonia's ACCIO highlighted investment opportunities in Türkiye's robust chemicals industry, reaffirming the country's position as a powerhouse for advanced manufacturing at the nexus of global value chains.

Through these engagements, Investment and Finance Office continued to strengthen Türkiye's global investment narrative while deepening its dialogue with international investors, business communities, and institutional partners.

As Investment and Finance Office marks its 20th anniversary, it will continue to work alongside global stakeholders to unlock new opportunities, strengthen investor confidence, and advance Türkiye's long-term competitiveness as a premier FDI destination.

## Ankara NATO Summit Delivers Major Industrial, Investment, and Innovation Commitments

Türkiye successfully hosted the 36<sup>th</sup> NATO Heads of State and Government Summit at the Presidential Complex in Ankara, bringing together the leaders of all 32 NATO member states, nearly 100 ministers, 1,000 delegates, and approximately 4,800 senior diplomats, representatives of international organizations, and invited guests.

Hosted by President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan and chaired by NATO Secretary General Mark Rutte, the two-day summit marked the first NATO leaders' meeting held in Ankara and Türkiye's second time hosting a NATO Summit, 22 years after the 2004 Istanbul Summit.

The Presidential National Library served as the international media center, providing workspace for 1,800 people, 40 editing rooms, and extensive live broadcasting facilities. More than 2,500 journalists covered the summit, while broadcasts coordinated by TRT using 96 cameras, 18 outside-broadcast vehicles, and 26 broadcasting locations brought Ankara to audiences around the world. This broad international coverage significantly enhanced Ankara's global visibility and reinforced

Türkiye's position as a premier venue for high-level international dialogue.

The summit also generated substantial economic activity in the capital. Spending on accommodation, food and beverages, transportation, retail, and other services contributed approximately TRY 900 million to Ankara's economy. The arrival of thousands of delegates, media representatives, and guests created strong demand across the tourism and services sectors, demonstrating the direct economic value of hosting large-scale international events.

The Ankara Summit Declaration placed industrial capacity, investment, and technological transformation among the alliance's central priorities. Allies announced more than USD 50 billion in new procurement commitments and agreed to expand collective manufacturing capacity, strengthen cooperation with industry, and accelerate innovation.

The declaration also emphasized reducing defense trade barriers among allies and making greater use of NATO partnerships to deepen industrial cooperation. These measures are expected to support larger and more integrated supply chains, facilitate joint production, and create a more predictable business environment for companies operating across allied markets.



These commitments build on a broader expansion in defense-related investment. European allies and Canada increased their investments in core defense capabilities by more than USD 139 billion in 2025. The decisions taken in Ankara seek to translate this additional expenditure into greater production capacity and enhanced operational capabilities while strengthening industrial resilience.

Priority investment areas identified at the summit included integrated air and missile defense, deep precision-strike capabilities, unmanned systems, advanced technologies, intelligence, space, and cyber infrastructure. Allies also agreed to develop an interoperable transatlantic digital infrastructure and expand the deployment of advanced artificial intelligence models.

Held alongside the summit, the NATO Summit Defence Industry Forum brought together Allied ministers, senior officials, and representatives from more than 100 companies. Discussions focused on translating defense investment commitments into increased production, joint procurement, technological innovation, and stronger cooperation among governments, financial institutions, and industry.

Several new mechanisms were introduced to support these objectives. The NATO Front Door for Industry was launched to simplify engagement between companies and NATO, while the Strategy

for Industry-NATO Cooperation established a framework for closer collaboration. The NATO Innovation Scale-Up Package was also endorsed to accelerate the adoption and commercialization of emerging technologies.

NATO also announced plans to invest more than USD 40 billion over the next five years in counter-drone capabilities under the Drone Edge initiative. In addition, a call to action was issued to leading financial institutions to increase capital flows into the defense sector, supporting companies seeking to expand production, undertake R&D, and commercialize advanced technologies.

Energy security and infrastructure resilience also featured prominently on the investment agenda. Allies announced a EUR 27 billion investment to modernize NATO's fuel storage and distribution infrastructure and develop new facilities, including pipelines extending toward the alliance's eastern flank.

The successful organization of the summit demonstrated Türkiye's institutional capacity, advanced infrastructure, and extensive experience in hosting major international events. Comprehensive preparations covering transportation, accommodation, communications, media services, and event coordination enabled the summit to proceed smoothly while ensuring the uninterrupted functioning of daily life in the capital.





## Minister Şimşek Hosts Türkiye–EU High-Level Economic Dialogue in İstanbul

Industry and Technology Minister Treasury and Finance Minister Mehmet Şimşek hosted European Commission Economy and Productivity, and for Implementation and Simplification Commissioner Valdis Dombrovskis, together with senior European Union (EU) representatives, in İstanbul for the Türkiye–EU High-Level Economic Dialogue. The meeting focused on strengthening economic cooperation, enhancing competitiveness, and advancing deeper economic integration between Türkiye and the EU.

Minister Şimşek reaffirmed that Türkiye's EU membership remains the country's strategic objective while emphasizing the importance of expanding economic cooperation at a time of heightened geopolitical uncertainty and intensifying global competition. "EU membership remains Türkiye's strategic objective.

At a time of geopolitical uncertainty, supply chain reconfiguration and intensifying global competition, closer economic integration between Türkiye and the EU matters more than ever," Minister Şimşek said.

Minister Şimşek emphasized that Türkiye is well positioned to contribute to Europe's competitiveness agenda through new trade, energy, and transport corridors, critical minerals, defense industry cooperation, and reconstruction capacity, reinforcing Europe's resilience and long-term competitiveness.

The modernization of the Türkiye–EU Customs Union featured prominently on the agenda. Participants noted that extending its scope to cover services, agriculture, public procurement, and digital trade could unlock approximately EUR 400 billion in additional trade potential.

The dialogue also welcomed the proposed Industrial Accelerator Act, particularly its recognition of products manufactured in Türkiye as equivalent to those originating in the EU.

As part of efforts to further strengthen the legal framework underpinning the economic partnership, Türkiye announced that it will introduce amendments to its Public Procurement Law to ensure reciprocal equal treatment for EU firms participating in Türkiye's public procurement market.

In addition to the High-Level Economic Dialogue, Minister Şimşek met with representatives of the European Investment Bank (EIB), the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD), and the Council of Europe Development Bank (CEB).

He also joined business leaders from Türkiye and the EU under the High-Level Business Dialogue to discuss investment opportunities and the role of the private sector in supporting sustainable growth.

Highlighting the importance of continued economic integration and investment, Minister Şimşek stated: "In a more fragmented world, we should invest in greater integration. Modernizing the Customs Union is a strategic priority.

Public funding alone cannot meet tomorrow's investment needs, and mobilizing private capital at scale will be essential. A stable, predictable, and competitive business environment remains a key priority, supporting continued investment, production, and sustainable economic growth in Türkiye."

The High-Level Economic Dialogue reaffirmed the shared commitment of Türkiye and the EU to deepening economic cooperation, strengthening competitiveness, and building a more resilient and integrated economic partnership for the future.

## Minister Kacır Highlights Türkiye's Investment Momentum at Zonguldak Openings

Industry and Technology Minister Mehmet Fatih Kacır attended a series of inauguration ceremonies in the western Black Sea city of Zonguldak, opening seven projects as part of the city's industrial and technological development agenda.

Addressing the Zonguldak Industry and Technology Projects Opening Ceremony at Bülent Ecevit University, Minister Kacır underscored Türkiye's growing international prominence and highlighted the government's vision of transforming every city into a driver of production, employment, and exports.

Minister Kacır noted that Türkiye's hosting of the NATO Ankara Summit, where heads of state and government convened at the Presidential Complex under the chairmanship of President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan, demonstrated the country's growing influence on the global stage.

The Minister emphasized that the summit reflected Türkiye's position as a pivotal actor in global security, shaping outcomes at the negotiating table and standing as a reliable partner for allies around the world.

On the investment front, Minister Kacır highlighted that Türkiye's annual exports have grown from USD 36 billion to nearly USD 278

billion over the past 23 years, establishing the country as the leading exporter across the broad belt stretching from China to Central Europe.

In Zonguldak alone, incentives have mobilized TRY 887 billion in investments and created more than 22,000 jobs, while over 12,000 SMEs have received TRY 2.7 billion in support during the same period.

Minister Kacır also inaugurated the Modern Karton production facility in Kilimli, an USD 850 million investment with an annual production capacity of 650,000 tons that is expected to create 300 jobs at full capacity.

Built around recycled raw materials and resource-efficient production, the facility exemplifies Türkiye's commitment to high-value-added and sustainable manufacturing while reinforcing the country's competitive cost structure and logistical proximity to European markets.

As Türkiye advances its industrial transformation, the country continues to solidify its position as the nexus of manufacturing, innovation, and investment, reaffirming its ambition to become the region's foremost powerhouse for sustainable, high-value growth in the Türkiye Century.





## Minister Bolat Highlights Expanding Trade and Investment Opportunities with Syria

The Syrian Free Trade and Industrial Zones and Investment Environment Meeting was held in Istanbul, bringing together senior government officials and business representatives to discuss investment opportunities and the future of Türkiye-Syria economic relations.

The meeting featured Trade Minister Ömer Bolat, Syrian General Authority for Land and Sea Ports Head Qutaiba Ahmed Badawi, and Union of Chambers and Commodity Exchanges of Türkiye (TOBB) President Rifat Hisarcıklıoğlu.

Addressing the meeting, Minister Bolat stated that bilateral trade between Türkiye and Syria exceeded USD 3.75 billion in 2025, marking an increase of more than 40 percent.

The Minister reaffirmed the government's commitment to further expanding trade between the two countries.

Minister Bolat also emphasized the objective of reaching the USD 10

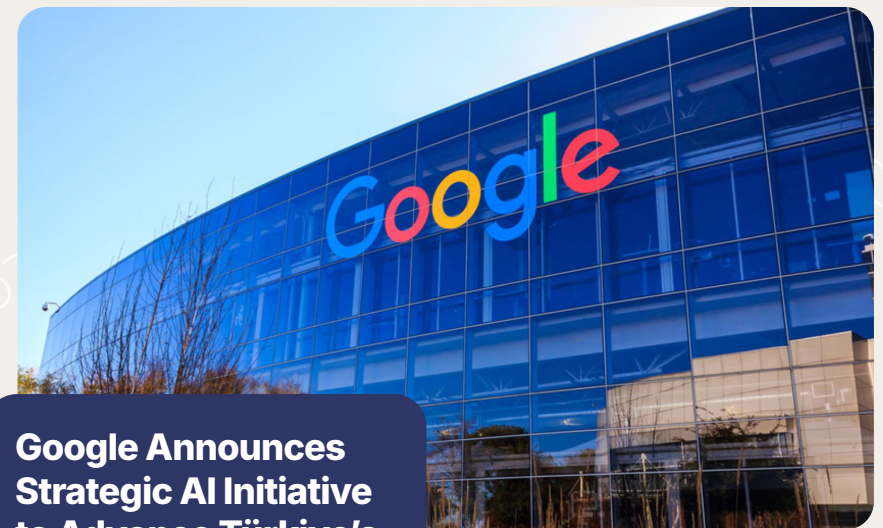
billion bilateral trade target set by the leaders of both countries.

He noted that trade and passenger crossings at border gates continue uninterrupted and announced that efforts are underway to open the Nusaybin-Qamishli Border Gate to trade, passenger traffic, and transit operations by the end of the year.

Highlighting the resumption of transit trade between Türkiye and Syria since April 2026, Minister Bolat said the development has improved trade flows to Gulf countries, including Saudi Arabia, the United Arab Emirates, Qatar, Kuwait, Oman, Bahrain, as well as Jordan, Lebanon, and Iraq.

He noted that transit routes through Saudi Arabia and Jordan, which had remained closed for nearly 14 years, have resumed regular operations, strengthening regional connectivity and logistics.

Minister Bolat also recalled that the Joint Customs Committee and the Joint Economic and Trade Committee (JETCO) between Türkiye and Syria were established in 2025, adding that the Damascus International Fair is scheduled to take place in September with broad international participation.



## Google Announces Strategic AI Initiative to Advance Türkiye's Public Sector Innovation

Türkiye's efforts to accelerate the adoption of AI across the public sector gained further momentum as Google unveiled a comprehensive strategic initiative during the AI Tomorrow Summit organized by the Artificial Intelligence Policy Association (AIPA).

The initiative introduces a new USD 2 million Google.org investment, alongside the "AI for Government" policy roadmap, reflecting Google's long-term commitment to collaborating with Türkiye to expand the use of AI across public services while creating economic and social value through the responsible adoption of AI.

Speaking at the summit, Google Türkiye Public Policy and Government Affairs Director Tolga Sobacı emphasized Türkiye's growing role in the global AI landscape.

"Visionary governments around the world are scaling AI to transform public services and unlock the next generation of economic value. With its strong digital infrastructure and dynamic talent pool, Türkiye is uniquely positioned to lead this global transformation. The local Google Cloud region, announced last year by a global hyperscaler, will serve as a key building block of this digital future."

As part of the initiative, Google will collaborate with leading Turkish institutions to advance AI applications in areas with significant public impact.

One of the flagship projects will modernize the national seismic monitoring network of the Kandilli Observatory and Earthquake Research Institute (KRDAE) through AI-powered technologies. Leveraging Google Cloud capabilities, the project aims to enhance the speed and accuracy of earthquake monitoring and strengthen early warning capabilities.

Another project will further develop the Türk-Ses platform, created by the AI Ecosystem Association, which uses AI to analyze voice patterns for the early detection of neurocognitive disorders, including Alzheimer's disease, helping enable earlier diagnosis and intervention.

The "AI for Türkiye" roadmap is built around three strategic priorities: accelerating the responsible integration of AI into public administration, fostering an innovation-friendly policy environment, and expanding AI capabilities across the workforce. Cloud-first and AI-first public policies, modern data infrastructure, and enabling regulatory frameworks are identified as the foundations of this transformation.

Google is also collaborating with public institutions to strengthen AI capabilities among public officials and sector leaders. Looking ahead, the initiative envisions broader deployment of AI and cloud technologies across sectors such as education, logistics, and cybersecurity, contributing to greater digital resilience, higher productivity, and Türkiye's international competitiveness.

This prestigious recognition marks another important milestone in our 20 year journey and reaffirms our dedication to institutional excellence, innovation, and public-sector productivity.

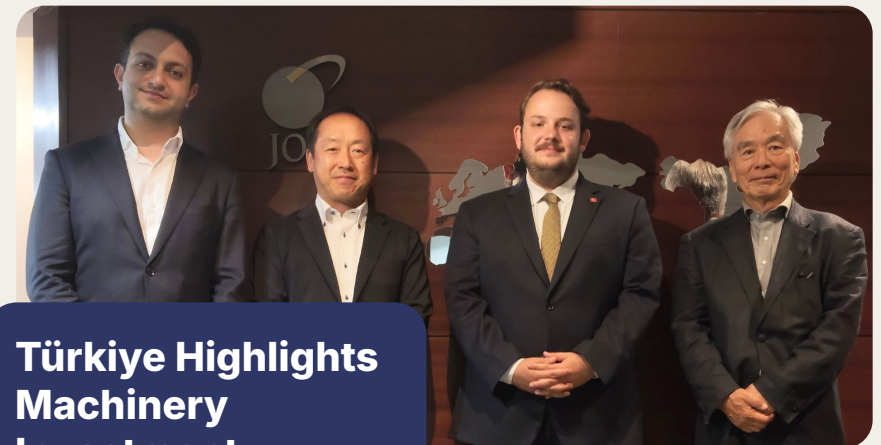


## Türkiye Advances Investment in Battery Energy Storage Systems at the BESS Investment Forum

Building on this, Investment and Finance Office Expert Hasan Yavuz Ünsal presented Türkiye's target of reaching 120 GW of installed wind and solar capacity by 2035, supported by a substantial pipeline of battery-integrated renewable energy projects.

Türkiye continues to strengthen its position as a regional powerhouse for green energy at the nexus of sustainability and investment.

Investment and Finance Office Analyst Yunus Emre Güneş presented an overview of Türkiye's industrial ecosystem, manufacturing strengths, and its deepening role in regional and global value chains.

The presentation focused on the IFC's incentive framework, global positioning, and vision to become a leading regional hub for Islamic finance and climate finance.

He also outlined Türkiye's climate ambitions in the lead-up to COP31 and emphasized the strategic role of the Istanbul Financial Center in advancing regional financial integration while supporting the sustainable growth of the takaful industry.

The summit provided a valuable platform to showcase Türkiye's strengths as a powerhouse for investments and an emerging regional center for participation finance.



## Türkiye Promotes Its Digital and Cybersecurity Ecosystem to US Business Leaders

The event provided an excellent opportunity to engage with founders, industry leaders, and ecosystem stakeholders while raising awareness of Türkiye's strengths as a powerhouse for technology investments.

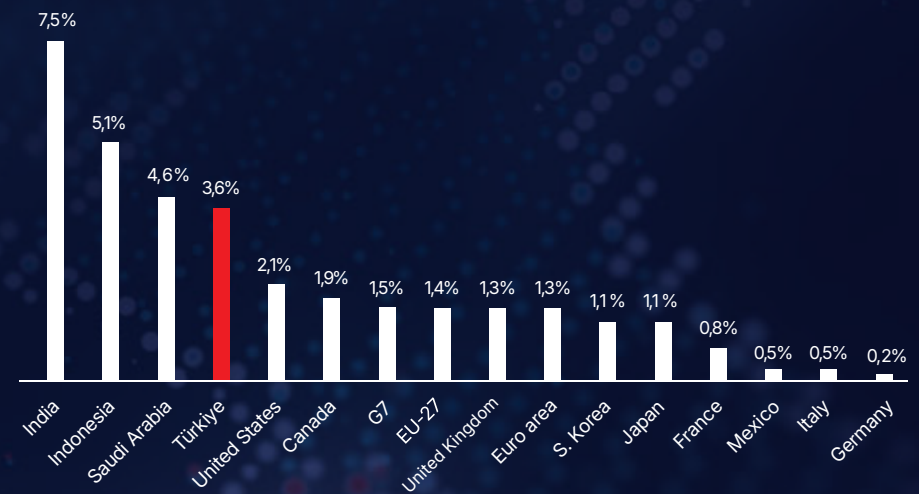

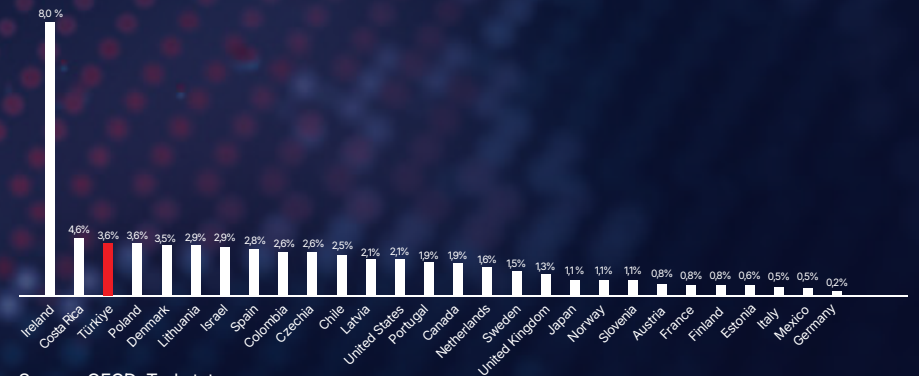
## REAL GDP GROWTH (2025, year on year growth)

### OECD Economies



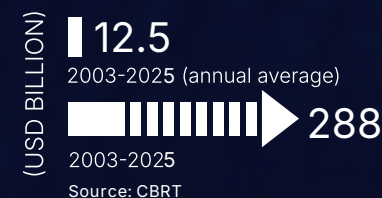

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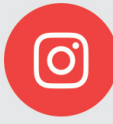
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
